- Conserving Montserrat's endemic plants;
- Leaving wild patches for nature;

- Growing a tea bush garden;
- Planting to create breeze, shade & shelter.

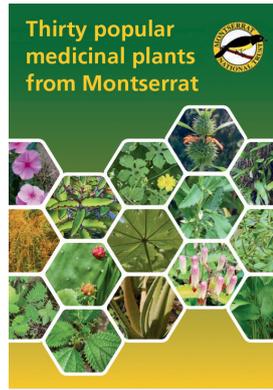

## Monitoring Biodiversity (Tools)

Help to track nature via your phone. Register & download the apps:

- iNaturalist – record plants & animals under 'Biodiversity of Montserrat' project
- Flower Insect Timed Count- to count pollinators.

Your observations matter. Data from iNaturalist feeds into a Global Biodiversity Information Facility-hosted biodiversity portal to support planning and conservation

- Blyss Day Spa supporting resilience by adapting to dry conditions to enhance opportunities for well-being.

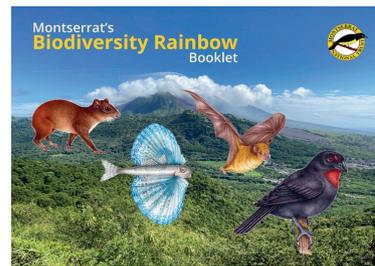
